Tier I Teacher Classroom Interventions

- Preferential Seating
- Calendar Outlint of Upcoming Assessments and Assignments
- Peer Helper in the Classroom
- Guided Notes - Outline of Notes prior to Class
- Reduce/Modify Assignments
- Exit Ticket – Answer 1-2 Questions based on Daily Lessons
- Provide answer Keys for Students to check Homework
- Daily communication with parent (email, call, note)
- Active Student Response (call on student 2-3 times during class)
- Daily performance and effort feedback (verbal, written, point system)
- Goal Setting (student sets a goal/teacher sets a goal – specific and measureable)
- Provide classroom supplies or materials (notebook, pencil, folder, etc)
- Provide Study Guide Highlighting Most Important Information
- Post Notes on D2L prior to lesson or email notes prior to lesson
- Additional conferences with student and/or parent
- Textbooks/ resources available for students to leave at home
- Discussion board questions/ help sessions on D2L
- Additional conferences with student and/or parent
- Provide additional instructional resources to be kept at home(textbook, workbooks, etc)
- Communicate with students other teachers for instructional strategies that have worked
- Additional instructional support time before school, after school, or during tutorial
- Class/ individual reward or incentive system
- Re-testing or redoing assignments for mastery
- Extended time/flexible due dates
- Alternate assignments for varied learning styles (ex: Project vs. book report)
